Mission workers return from the fields

PYF Mission 2007: Daytona Beach

The legendary racetrack, driving your car out on the beach - this is what one would normally associate with Daytona Beach, Florida. Members of PYF (Presbyterian Youth Fellowship) found a completely different side of the area on their recent trip to hot and sunny Florida. The mission team, 18 youth and 4 chaperones, spent five days working with inner city kids and adults with disabilities. Our members were joined by groups from LaPlata, Missouri and Belton, Texas. Teams were formed and sent out to work in one of seven ministry sites. Our church group worked in six of the seven sites. **The Salvation Army Day Camp, Kids Club, and The Bryan Children's**



Center were all day camps for local kids. Our mission teams were sent to assist local camp workers with the day to day operations of the camps. This included everything from organizing and participating in games, transporting kids to local activities and just being a part of their lives for a few days.

Other ministry sites included **The Braille Library**, a local warehouse used for sorting, rewinding and cataloging an inventory just over 3.3 million books on tape. **The Palmetto House**, a transitional housing unit for homeless individuals and families, was the center of the manual labor for the week.

Mission teams worked on restriping the parking lot, painting and general clean up. **WORC** (Work Oriented Rehabilitation Center) assists adults with disabilities with job skills and housing. Mission teams spent time learning about the activities of the center as well as getting to know some of the participants.

Mwandi Mission 2007

Our relationship with the African village of Mwandi spans two decades. From the hospital electrification project back in 1990, to the ongoing work with the Orphans and Vulnerable Children (OVC) Center, to the fund-raising for the hospital endowment fund, to the ongoing communications project, we have been very involved, not only by our financial support, but by sending a variety of volunteers to work on site.

This year we once again partnered with Lake Norman Fellowship (our "daughter" church) to send nine volunteers in mission. The team departed from Charlotte on June 25 and returned July 11. While in Mwandi, they worked in the hospital, helped with the OVC center, installed a new satellite communications infrastructure at the OVC, secured the hospital network against "unauthorized users," visited and prayed with residents and assisted in Bible studies and preaching. Most importantly, the team built some lasting relationships with our sisters and brothers in Christ who live there in Mwandi.

The love of Christ manifested in the warm reception of the local community was perhaps the most memorable aspect of the trip. The smiles and laughter of children at the OVC, the tender moments with patients in the hospital, the perseverance of the Kandiana (Old Age/Homeless shelter) residents and the hospitality of the local church all cemented our new friendships and confirmed the reality of the worldwide fellowship in Christ's Church.

The team, which included Kathy Ballard (FPC), Carolyn Brawley (FPC), Fred Coates (FPC), Jean Coates (FPC), Kirk Bleavens (LNF), Brenden Bleavins (LNF), Bonnie Polansky (LNF), Doug Vinez (LNF) and Sarah Welch (LNF), presented a report during the church school hour on July 29.

Logos/MSM begins its 29th year at FPC



The Logos/Middle School Ministry (MSM) program is set to begin its 29th year at First Presbyterian on Wednesday, September 5. We have children now attending Logos whose parents attended Logos as children themselves!

The Logos/MSM program is a midweek program for youth in first through eighth grades, and consists of Bible study, worship skills, recreation, and dinner. The Logos program is open to children in first through sixth grades, while the MSM program is open to children in seventh and eighth grades.

The primary goal of the Logos/MSM program is to develop genuine and lasting relationships between young people and Jesus Christ, between young people and their ministers, parents, other adults of the congregation, and their peers.

Those involved in Logos/MSM leadership believe that our program provides an unparalleled vehicle for Christian Education during the week. By spreading the program over a several-hour span that includes dinner and recreation events, the experience is much like that of a summer camp or conference. All four parts of the program are interdependent and necessary for a complete Logos/MSM experience.

An essential part of the Logos/MSM program is parent participation. All parents are required to volunteer in some capacity each semester their child is enrolled in the program, usually performing kitchen duties, although opportunities are available to assist in Bible classes, recreation, nursery and music. A fee is also charged for participation in the program - a \$30 registration fee and a \$45 per semester tuition fee. Scholarship help is available upon request; please contact Ellen Auten or Valerie Mauney to request scholarship assistance.

This year's program director is Valerie Mauney (704-663-7540); assistant director is Leeann DeCastro (704-660-5248). Please feel free to call Valerie or Leeann with questions.

Catechism Club to begin a new year



Catechism Club is scheduled to begin a new year in September, with classes held during fall 2007 and spring 2008. Children in third through sixth grades are encouraged to participate.

For those unfamiliar with catechism, it is a book which gives a brief summary of the basic principles of Christianity in question and answer form. Children will learn basic theological vocabulary and gain an understanding of the Christian faith that will lay a foundation for their belief and trust in God through Jesus Christ. Children in Catechism Club will be encouraged to memorize the 150 questions of the *First Catechism*, and will have weekly instruction in basic Bible truths.

Parental participation and attendance at Sunday meetings is essential; if parents are unable to attend, an adult sponsor will be matched with the child wanting to attend.

The class will be held from 5:30-6:15 p.m., with supper to follow the class from approximately 6:15-6:45 p.m. This fall's schedule is as follows: Sundays, September 9, 16, 23, 30, October 7, 21, 28, November 4, 11, 18.

Adult mentors are an integral part of Catechism Club. They will "sponsor" a child through the process of catechism memorization and instruction, meeting frequently with the child. Following successful completion of catechism instruction and memorization, the children will be recognized in a worship service.

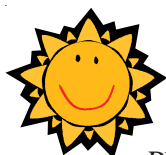
Registration will take place in the church parlor on August 19 and 26, before and after the worship services, or you may call Ellen Auten (704-664-5275) in the church office to register.

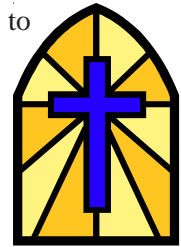
