FOR HOLY WEEK AND EASTER SERVICES

This holy season of the year marks an important and significant time in our spiritual journeys as we share together our traditional Palm Sunday, Maundy Thursday and Easter Sunday services and add a new one—a noon Good Friday service with a light meal following.

Palm Sunday, March 16, 8:30 & 11:00 a.m.

In our 8:30 and 11:00 a.m. worship services on Palm Sunday, March 16, we will celebrate with a traditional children’s processional with palms at the beginning of both services. Children who would like to be in the processional should meet in the Parlor immediately prior to the worship services. After the processional, children in first grade and older may sit with their families, while younger children will return to the nursery after the Children’s Sermon.

You’re also encouraged to bring your used or outgrown winter coats to church on Palm Sunday, symbolically “laying down your coat for Jesus,” just as the people of Jerusalem lined his path with their cloaks and palm branches for Christ’s triumphal entry. All coats will be donated to the Mooresville Christian Mission.

Maundy Thursday, March 20, 6:30 p.m.

You’re encouraged to attend our traditional Maundy Thursday service on Thursday, March 20, in the Fellowship Hall. This observance takes its name from the new “mandate” Jesus gives his disciples of loving one another as he loves them and from his institution of the Lord’s Supper, instructing his followers to “do this in remembrance of me.”

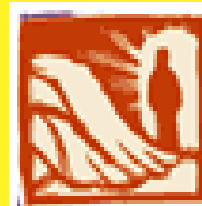
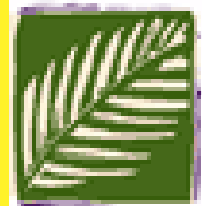
We begin with a fellowship supper in the Fellowship Hall at 6:30 p.m. After supper, we’ll stay together in the Fellowship Hall for worship, starting at about 7:15 p.m. This year’s worship service features something traditional and beloved: a special observance of the Lord’s Supper around each dinner table. It also features something new: a dramatic presentation, “The Living Last Supper,” by our Chancel Choir and some of our best actors and speakers. We will conclude the service in darkness, commemorating the suffering and death of Christ. Childcare for preschoolers will be provided during the worship service portion of the evening.

Good Friday, March 21, Noon

It has been a number of years since our church has observed Good Friday. So we are reviving this tradition with a noon service on March 21 with the community in mind. We’ve designed our Good Friday observance to fit within a 60 minute time frame, so that business people may take their lunch hour to worship and then to share a light lunch in the church Parlor. The brief service will start at 12:00 p.m., and lunch will be served around 12:30 p.m. The lunch will be provided by Chick-Fil-A and will cost \$5 per person. Everyone is invited!

Easter Sunday, March 23, 8:30 & 11:00

“The Lord is risen! He is risen indeed!” is the triumphal cry we will shout as we celebrate the Resurrection of Jesus Christ during our 8:30 and 11:00 a.m. services March 23. Our Chancel Choir and Orchestra will share in the Easter good news in music. Lilies will abound! The sermon will focus on Philippians 3:7-11, “The Power of His Resurrection.” We’ll conclude the service by singing that great hymn, “Because He Lives.”





From the Pastor

HOW NOT TO HAVE AN ANEMIC EASTER...

I know what you're asking yourself in light of the above title of this article. "How on earth can anyone have an anemic Easter?" you wonder. "Easter's a great day! We go to church, hunt and find Easter eggs, and enjoy time together as a family. What's so anemic about that?"

What does "anemic" mean? I'm using it here not in the technical medical sense of a condition that must be addressed by doctors, diet, and medicines. I'm speaking more in the general sense of the word. When we say something is anemic, we mean that it is lacking in something vital for vigor. It's weak, feeble, and lackluster. It's pale, colorless, and bland. It's like a meal of unseasoned white rice and lukewarm tap water. You can get it down and it will nourish you for a while, but it's not much fun in the process, and over the long run it will not sustain you well.

How does this tie in with Easter? I'm convinced that many people experience an anemic Easter year after year. They go through the same rituals and traditions. But those rituals and traditions have no pizzazz, no umph, to them. It's the same old thing. Easter is just another day—a day with better food and nicer clothes than most, to be sure, but still just another day. Christ the Lord is risen today. Yawn.

Let me share with you the way to avoid the trap of an anemic Easter. You simply need to practice one thing. That one thing is this: you must journey through the pain of the Cross before you arrive at the joy of the Resurrection.

Many times we're not patient enough for that, however. We want to short-circuit the process. We want the joy of Easter Sunday without ever considering the pain of Maundy Thursday and Good Friday. Let's have the triumphal procession into Jerusalem on Palm Sunday, and then jump right over to the empty tomb the next Sunday. No pain, no blood, no depressing stories about suffering, heartache, and loss. Just the good stuff, please.

What do I mean about getting to the Resurrection through the Cross? I mean that you start by reflecting on the Cross in all its ugliness, horror, and fear. You must face up to the reality of the human condition that requires the Cross to set it straight. To be blunt, we're sinners. You're a sinner. I'm a sinner. We cannot atone for or otherwise meaningfully address our own sins. My condition is such that even the very best deed, thought, or feeling I can offer is usually tainted in some way. It may be in a small, subtle way, or it may be in a large, overt way. But the stain remains. On the Cross, Jesus suffered in a manner inconceivable by mortal human beings. His pain was not only physical. His greatest pain was spiritual and emotional. He, in taking our sins upon himself, was separated and alienated from his Father. It is why he says on the Cross, "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?" Such is the depth of his suffering on our behalf.

It is only as we realize our absolute and total need for the Cross that the Resurrection becomes relevant and meaningful. The Resurrection shows that the Cross does not have the last word, that human sinfulness does not end the story. The One who dies for us is raised to life for us. We are joyful because of him who has overcome the power of sin and death through a stronger Power: the Power of God, of life eternal and grace amazing. It is the Cross that gives the Resurrection its tang, its zip, its flavor.

So if your Easter Sunday has been ho-hum and boring, then turn to the Cross first. Stay there awhile. Think on what Jesus has done, is doing, and will do for you by his once-and-for-all sacrifice for your sins. Then you'll be ready to praise God for the victory of Easter and new, abundant life.

SESSION HIGHLIGHTS

JANUARY 2008

During its January 27th stated meeting, the Session:

- Studied Exodus 14, the Israelite crossing of the Red Sea, as an introduction to a series of Bible studies the board will conduct during its 2008 meetings, *The Red Sea Rules*.
- Prayed for the needs of the church.
- Approved a project to re-landscape the Preschool playground.
- Set dates for communion for 2008: Feb. 10 (1st Sun. in Lent), Mar. 20 (Maundy Thurs.), May 4 (Confirmation Sun.), June 15, Aug. 10, Oct. 5 (World Communion Sun.), Oct. 26 (Reformation Sun.), Nov. 30 (1st Sun. of Advent), and Jan. 4, 2009 (Epiphany).
- Amended the operating budget to include a \$750 line item for college ministry.
- Voted to amend the church's Standards of Procedure to increase the Missions Committee to 15 members and to set the quorum for the examination of new officers at 7 elders plus the moderator. These items will need a second affirmative vote at the February stated meeting to take effect.
- Elected commissioners to 2008 meetings of Salem Presbytery.
- Created a committee to review membership rolls and to report back to the Session.
- Set in motion a process by which some of the parking slots on the church's Broad St. lot may be leased to Windstream.
