## *From the Pastor...*

### Two Studies on the Most Important Event in History...

We are coming down the home stretch of the Lenten season into the celebration of Easter. Our Lent thus far has been good for us and challenging at times as we have moved through Jesus' journey as recorded in Mark's Gospel.

But the payoff is coming soon. The payoff is the most important event ever: the crucifixion and resurrection of Jesus Christ.

"Hey, wait, aren't these two different events?" you ask. In terms of timing, the answer is "yes." In linear terms, obviously Jesus had to die on the Cross before he could be raised from the dead. But the Crucifixion and the Resurrection are meant to be seen as a package deal, as two bookends that must be taken and understood together if we are to see the true impact.

Because the Crucifixion and Resurrection are so important, I will teach two courses following Easter that will help put the Crucifixion and Resurrection into their right perspective. The courses are for two distinctly different audiences and sets of needs. Look below and see which one would work best for you:

#### **Course #1: "EXPLAINING CHRISTIANITY"**

- **WHO:** For self-acknowledged non-Christians, seekers, skeptics, un-churched, and de-churched people—in short, anyone wondering about Christianity, doing so without a lot of background in it, and wanting some straight answers.
- **WHEN:** Four Sundays, starting April 26 through May 17, 10:00-10:45 a.m.
- **WHERE:** Church Library (Room 232).
- **WHAT & HOW:** We'll look at the central beliefs of Christianity, using some of the original source materials. We will assume no prior knowledge or experience. You won't be asked to pray or to read the Bible aloud, and you won't be asked to answer questions. There will, however, be opportunity for discussion.
- **SIGN-UP:** Contact the church office at 704-664-5275 or [nellie@moorevillefirstpres.org](mailto:nellie@moorevillefirstpres.org) by Friday, April 24.

#### **Course #2: "THE CORE OF THE GOSPEL"**

- **WHO:** For Christians who want to be grounded in "the faith that was once for all delivered to the saints" (Jude, v. 3, ESV) and to be ready to "give an answer to everyone who asks you to give the reason for the hope that you have" (1 Peter 3:15, NIV). Why? Because a faith that is grounded is a faith that will guide, grow, and encourage you and is a faith that can be expressed with others.
- **WHEN:** Four Thursdays, starting April 16 through May 7, 7:15-8:30 p.m.
- **WHERE:** Church Parlor
- **WHAT & HOW:** We'll use the Bible (so bring yours) and the booklet "Two Ways to Live: The Choice We All Face" (provided at the first class) to explore and express the core of the Gospel message.
